



New students to USU are specially invited for a tour of the campus hosted by experienced Quidditch players.



In addition to refereeing, Niel has also contributed to the growth of the sport through manning fair booths, and taking up the role of acting commissioner. He is one of the first Quidditch Players documented in the state playing IQA rules (as a Keeper) and has even contacted the IQA about helping start a possible Jr. League for younger players.

How to Fly:

Tips and Tricks to **Using Your Broomstick**



Whether you are a proud owner of a handcrafted masterpiece or a light weight lobby accessory, running with a broom can pose a few challenges to new players. One of the distinguishing aspects to the game of Bludgers and Snitches broomstick, and mastering it is a large part of getting ahead in Quidditch.

Listed here are a few helpful hints which can improve your game, and turn what can be a hindrance into the sporting gear of a champion.

Stick to your Broom: Some players make the mistake of switching brooms among practices and games. Once you purchase or receive a broom, use it consistently (if possible) so that you are familiar with the weight,

steadiness, size. and other attributes over time. Changing it up can give your opponents an unfair advantage as you try to adjust and adapt midgame.




Find the Right Balance: Does the seat of your broom rest just before the bristles? Is it easier to run while holding it lower or higher? As long as your broom is under you as you run and you hold it with your hand or thighs, you are free to develop your own riding style. Try new things (such as having more or less of the broom in front of you) to see what works best with your game play.



Consider Accessories: The IQA rulebook outlaws anything which attaches your broom to you; however you still have many options. Wearing gloves with grip can improve your hold of the broom. Adding athletic wrap to your broom can keep it from sliding around. Longer bristles may help keep opponents from getting to close. As you think outside the box, you may be surprised with what you can add to your game. (Just make sure to run new ideas by your ref before a game.) Good luck!

Monthly Position Tips:



The quality of your Chasers can make or break your team. Just about anyone could be a Chaser, but athleticism, speed and the ability to take a hit isn't everything you should look for. The most effective Chasers know how to play on a team, and rely on other players. Passing, dodging, getting back up, cutting through tight spaces and acting as a human shield are all part of the job. Although this position has just as much running as the Beater or Seeker positions, the tackling element of the game is what sets Chasers apart. They tend to do it the most, so keep that in mind.

Practices with Chasers are simple to put together. Games similar to "pig" or 'horse" in basketball all make for good aiming practice. A very effective drill places the whole team against one chaser, who runs from the other end of the pitch to try to get past all others before scoring. Rotating between three chasers and repeating the drill many times can be helpful to the whole team. • Positions per team: 3 • Game ball: Quaffle • Headband color: White • Main job: Score to earn points for your team!
